

Showjumping Competition

All Events will be run under Article 238.2.2 – one round and a Jump Off

Riders may compete as individuals as well as for a school team.

Riders may compete in two classes in one ring only – Ring1 or Ring2

Ring 1

Class 1 – 80cm
Class 2 – 90cm
Class 3 – 100cm
Class 4 – 105cm

Ring 2

Class 5 – 50cm
5a – Senior
5b – Primary

Class 6 – 60cm
6a – Secondary
6b – Primary

Class 7 – 70cm
7a – Secondary
7b – Primary

Class 8 – 80cm
(may be run in Ring1)
8a – Secondary
8b – Primary

Ribbons to 6th place awarded to individuals in all groups – to be eligible riders must compete in two classes.

Shields awarded to the highest placed Primary and Secondary school team on the day. The shields for the school team will be awarded to:

Senior Shield:

The High School or College with the three highest placed individuals, to include 2 riders from Ring1.

Primary Shield:

The Primary School with the three highest placed individuals for either ring.

Showjumping Challenge Shield:

The highest placed team on the day. The school team will consist of the three highest placed individuals for the school with a minimum of one rider from each ring.

Conditions of Entry

- The event will be conducted under Pony Club Rules
- Horses must be ridden in a snaffle bit for dressage as per PC rules
- Riders must represent the school they currently attend and the school must approve the entry
- Riders must be a current member of a pony club or EA and hold a current membership card. Those not holding current membership may complete a day insurance form at an additional cost of \$10.
- Entry fees must accompany the entry form
- **Riders can compete with one horse only in each discipline. They can compete in a maximum of two dressage tests— both tests must be ridden in the same group and two showjumping competitions—both rounds must be in the same ring.**
- Riders are to nominate which group and ring they will be competing in on the entry form
- Riders may ride as individuals as well as for a school team— to be eligible for individual or team awards, riders must compete in two tests for the dressage competition or two classes for the showjumping competition.
- TPRC reserves the right to limit numbers. It may be necessary to limit numbers of entries from each school. Depending on the number of entries, it may be necessary to split groups
- This competition is eligible to be used as a qualifier for State Championships
- Late entries will not be accepted
- Horses must be present and riders to be mounted for final presentation, which will take place at the completion of all events
- The organising committee would appreciate notification of scratchings
- There will not be any refund of entries on the notification of scratchings unless a doctors or Vet certificate is produced.
- Riders must present for a gear check prior to competing in the first event
- Riders are to ride in draw order—**please allow for scratchings**
- Called Tests will attract a 5 point penalty
- Riders are to ride in School jumper or rugby top, shirt, tie, approved safety helmet, (AS/NZS 3838, EN1384 (manufactured before 31.12.15), ASTM F1163, PAS015 or VGI.), jodhpurs and riding boots

Shields Awarded to the highest placed Primary and Secondary school team on the day.

The shields for the school teams will be awarded to:

Senior Shield:

The secondary school with the three highest placed individuals but must include at least 1 representative from either Group A or B.

Primary Shield:

The primary school with the three highest placed individuals from any Group.
